

Nunobiki Dam

(Nunobiki Gohonmatsu Entei)

Built in 1900, a registered Tangible Cultural Property of Japan.

Nine sections, including dams and bridges that retain their original appearance, have been designated as National Important Cultural Properties of Japan.

Nunobiki Falls is made of water that comes from Kawauso-ike (Otter Lake) in the Rokko mountain range, which collects water from Mt. Maya and Mt. Futatabi.

Ontaki Falls

At 43m high, this is the longest waterfall in Nunobiki. The waterfall basin is 430m and 6.6m deep.



Tsuzumigadaki Falls

The name of this waterfall came from the drum (tsuzumi) sounds it produces. (About a 10-min walk from Shin-Kobe)



Mentaki Falls

A beautiful 19m high waterfall that looks as if it were draped in silk (About a 5-min walk from Shin-Kobe Sta.)



36 monuments of famous poems composed from the Heian period to the Edo period are scattered along the hiking trail, from the lower reaches of Shinikutagawa River to Shin-Kobe Station to the scenic overlook.

Nunobiki-no-taki Falls

The name comes from its appearance as the stream of water looks like a draped cloth (nunobiki). You'd never guess that such a beautiful natural sanctuary could sit so close to the city. This revered waterfall which comes in four sections (the longest is 43m tall) has been the subject of art, poetry and worship for centuries - some of the poems are reproduced on stone tablets at the site. It's accessible by a steep 400m path from Shinkōbe-Eki Sta. Take the ground-floor exit, turn left and walk under the station building to the path.
